Why pie? **P.I.E. stands for Public, Intentional, & Explicit** — the United Church's standards for becoming affirming. LENT

Our Lenten Theme for 2019: Baptism in Action!

Baptism celebrates God's initiative and our response. It is God's "Yes" to us, and our "Yes" to God. It is a sign of the Divine-human covenant. Baptism flows from God's unmerited grace and pours out in lives of gratitude and commitment. As initiation into the Church, the Body of Christ, it is an act of welcoming, blessing, and belonging.

The covenant of baptism celebrates the fullness of God's grace throughout the story of salvation: in creation and in exodus, in wilderness and in exile, in birth and in death. In his baptism, Jesus received the Holy Spirit and was declared God's beloved, he opened himself to repentance and forgiveness, and marked a new beginning in his ministry. In our baptism we are similarly claimed, called, and commissioned.

Our baptismal identity is both individual and communal. Baptism honours the diversity of individuals and challenges us to be a community of equals.

This Lent, you are invited to remember the promises made for you at Baptism. These promises are about belief in God. They asked about your commitment to seek justice and resist evil, your commitment to follow the way of Jesus, your commitment to the mission and ministry of the church. These promises included a commitment from sponsors/mentors and from the congregation where you were baptized. If you have been here for a baptism, you have made promise to the baby/child/family as members of this congregation. And so this Lent, we will go deeper into these promises, to learn more about how we live them out, how we practice our faith, how we strengthen our connection with God and with this community. Baptism is multifaceted. It isn't about only one thing, but many.

This Lent, I hope you will join me in this deepening exercise: to get closer to God, to foster better relationships in this community and to practice your faith in the world. This is a holy time. This is holy work. Let us embrace it together. Please think about a special commitment you can make or something you can do to remember your baptism, share your faith or strengthen your connection with God during Lent. Here are some ideas: help an elderly neighbor, bring a friend to church, study or read more, set up a prayer schedule for yourself, volunteer with your family to help others, pick up your toys, or help a younger brother or sister. There are paper crosses available at the entrances to the church so that you might write what you will do this Lent. Please find a spot on the cross at the front and pin your intention there.

Listen for a Minute for Mission-esque personal story around the time of the offering called 'Baptism in Action'.

Here are the questions we will be looking at this Lent:

Profession of Faith in the Triune God: March 10

Do you believe in God, who has created and is creating,
who has come in Jesus, the Word made flesh,
to reconcile and make new,
and who works in us and others by the Spirit?

Commitment to Seek Justice and Resist Evil: March 17

Will you follow in the way of Jesus Christ,
resisting oppression and evil, seeking justice,
and witnessing to God's love for all creation?

Commitment to Follow the Way of Jesus: March 24

Will you follow the way of Jesus Christ?

Commitment to the Mission and Ministry of the Church: March 31

Will you join with your brothers and sisters in this congregation
to share in the life, work, and ministry of Jesus Christ?

Congregational Commitment: April 7

Let us pledge to this/these person(s) our continued support and care.

We will continue to support you, walk with you, and grow with you.

With God's help, we will live out our baptism as a loving community in Jesus Christ: nurturing one another in faith, upholding one another in prayer, encouraging one another in God's work.

Faith Formation

This Lent, join us in reading and discussing spiritual poems by Canadian authors. In every Friday File from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, you will find a link to a different poem that discusses faith. During Coffee Hour each Sunday, we will read the poem and Charlie will lead a short, casual discussion — all are welcome for this "mini poetry club."


