Message from Council Chair - Ian McGregor

Greetings everyone,

We do hope you are continuing to fare well during this trying time of physical distancing. We are moving forward, but the church building will remain closed at least for the immediate future. Rev. Jenni, just back from a well-deserved vacation, will continue to participate in Sunday morning worship at Rideau Park UC (via their website) and to reach out through Zoom to continue a number of activities such as the Book Discussion Group, and Thursday morning 10 am coffee.

Having said this, Denise and a number of members are examining when and how to open the church for services – with safety being their prime concern. The Montessori school will open in August, and Doug Brooks has done an admirable job in ensuring that we qualify for the government wage subsidies available at the moment.

Thus, financially, our situation is looking more positive. Notwithstanding, our revenues are down, largely the result of reduced plate offerings given the absence of regular services.
