Message from Rev. Jenni



Good Friday to you all,

On a recent drive on the 174, I noted just how many trees were changing colour and how beautiful they are. Sure, trees in my neighbourhood are changing colour as well, but the consistent beauty of every-other-tree was thrilling. Yes, I'm one of these insufferable people who love every season. Watching my garden, as you know, has been a joy for me throughout the summer and tasting the fruits of it have been delicious. I have a couple of large sheets that I've been throwing over the tomatoes when there has been a frost warning and, I suppose, I will give that up at some point and let the season take its course.
