Message from Rev. Jenni



Hello everyone and happy Friday!

I hope you have a little something special planned for yourself this weekend - even if it might be considered "a small thing"! I have some tulip bulbs to be planted, a bunch of green tomatoes to be taken off the vines and tomato and patty pan squash vines to be pulled up. I have garlic to be planted, but I think I will leave that as another special thing for another weekend. I have a few small things that are special for me this weekend: leftovers in the fridge that mean I don't have to think about what's for

lunch, a couple of books I've been looking forward to reading (Resilience: the life and death and life of Julie S. Lalonde and Red, White and Royal Blue.) and a farmer's market to go to on Sunday very close to my house.

It really is the small things that can keep us going, I find, if we are able to focus on them as special. For example, I was planting tulips last week (Rembrandt Tulips, see picture attached). I dug the hole, about 6 inches deep in my front garden; I sprinkled some bone meal in the hole and mixed it around. I put 3 or 5 bulbs, probably too close together at first, and then sprinkled the loose soil back over top. As I did this I paid close attention to not toppling the bulb over, sprinkling the soil in a kind of baptism of protection for the long months ahead of darkness. I sprinkled the soil in awe of the tulip bulbs: hardy, not afraid of the dark, not afraid to be buried, not afraid to be left to themselves for a long period of time. I sprinkled the soil in awe of their trajectory: from bulb without roots, to roots shooting down, small sprout shooting up (eventually) towards the springtime light. I sprinkled them with the soil which would be their home: comfortable, soft and warm. I sprinkled some more protective bone meal overtop: silent blessing of nurture, growth, hope.

God's loving care is like this. God tends God's garden: both us and all of creation. God blesses us with the loving kindness of soil and bone meal, blesses us continuously in circumstances/situations of darkness and isolation, KNOWING we are going to put down roots, reach our sprouts to the light and blossom into beauty.

When we tend God's Creation, we are doing the work of God: the work of loving, tending, blessing. To be clear: I am not God. None of us are God when we plant tulip bulbs. We are agents of God, disciples, if you will, called to promote and love life, kindness, beauty. These actions give us hope; teach us grace, patience and wisdom.

Together with God, we foster a world where there is planting, blessing, waiting, blooming. Sometimes we are being planted with love by others, sometimes we are doing the planting and blessing. At all times, God is with us. At all times, God surrounds us with love. At all times, God believes in our growth. At all times, we are surrounded by possibilities.
