More and more people are contracting covid and I guess I didn't want to believe it when an official (might have been Dr. Fauci?) said something like 'one day we'd all get it'. It has visited this household - we think Delaney brought it home from school after eating lunch with a good friend. It did take several days to become symptoms, but they were mild: a slight sore throat, occasional coughing. I tested positive on Wednesday and my symptoms are the same, plus an occasional mild headache. We are very lucky to have had both shots and a booster - we likely have them to thank for it being very mild. I'm very thankful for this. Hooray for science! As one of you wrote to me:"(I) am sure you've all been doing your best - and remember you all got this far after unrelenting discipline which has been so hard to keep up- and now the covid choreography at home begins." Unrelenting discipline indeed. I appreciated reading those words, as at first, it felt a little bit like a failure: contracting it after trying so hard not to.

I've recently discovered a book on my library app (Libby) called *Stories from Quarantine*, a book by the New York Times. It came out last month and includes authors Margaret Atwood, Colm Toibin and many others. It is based on the concept of *The Decameron*, written in 1353, by Giovanni Boccaccio. "It contains one hundred nested tales told by a group of young men and women passing the time at a villa outside Florence while waiting out the gruesome Black Death, a plague that killed more than 25 million people. I have only made it through a few stories and they are resonating in my soul: the fear we all felt in March 2020, the isolation, the online shopping, the loneliness. Trying to make sense of a 'new normal' without any idea how to do that. So, we all improvised. We read more, walked more, cooked at home more. We all spent a lot more time with those we live with.

Diana and I have been talking about having a celebration at some point to say "yay we made it through" and we thought that might be this spring/summer. Perhaps the fall? We really don't know. But what we do know is that we are still a community of faith, still keen to gather together safely, still gathered around the word of God.

Whatever you do this weekend, know that you are a valuable, cherished member of the Kitchissippi community, beloved by God.


FIBRE FLING 2022 Virtual Art Show and Sale
