I've been wanting to highlight the work of United in Learning - an education wing of the United Church - but am just getting around to it now. What is very interesting is that all of their webinars relate to the church.

Besides their Racial Justice Training workshops (which I have been trained to facilitate), there are webinars on Poverty and how, as church people, we can respond. (It is a 6-part series and it started this past Wednesday, but you can still jump in this Wednesday!)

There are mental health webinars, and one that I've got in my agenda for Tuesday evening is Mental Health WISE Church: Communities of Faith as Places of Welcome, Inclusion, and Support. Sounds pretty interesting, hey? Who wants to join me? See below for more details. (There were two others in the series that were recorded so they can be watched at any time.)

If you can't make it to any of the webinars, they record all of them and have them available on their website.

If I know nothing about Kitchissippi people, I know this - you are lifelong learners! You love learning new things, you read newspapers, books and online resources and so I knew I had to highlight the work of United in Learning. I really think you'd get a lot out of it. (I know our treasurer, Doug Brooks, has taken many of the Church Treasurer webinars and very successfully got us through the pandemic using his own and their expertise.)

If you have any questions about the Racial Justice sessions, please write to me? There is one this weekend if you identify as white and want to sit in on it - from **12-2:30 on Saturday**. Please be in touch with me if you want to check it out? It is Session 1 and it is solely for white people.

It's halfway between the spring equinox and summer solstice and has been celebrated by a number of cultures for centuries. It's also observed as a worker's rights day in countries around the world!

Peace cranes for Ukraine

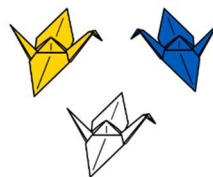
This Sunday we will be distributing paper and instructions for making peace cranes while we pray for peace in Ukraine and around the world. We'll hear a bit more about paper cranes in Learning Time and we invite you to bring back your cranes as well as your Easter colouring mosaic piece next Sunday for Mother's Day.

We are working on a small way to show support for the people of Ukraine and pray for peace at the same time. This Sunday we gave out blue and yellow origami paper and instructions for how to make origami (paper) cranes. They are a symbol of the hope for peace.

We also distributed some paper and sample cranes to a few families who hadn't yet received their Easter kits (sorry!! between Covid close contacts etc., some deliveries got delayed). If you would like a sample crane and some paper please be in touch in the next few days and we'll try to get some delivered and/or work out a time for you to pick it up from church.

We invite you to try making a crane, and to bring it this **Sunday May 8th** -- we will hang them up together after church. Making cranes takes concentration and practice! You may wish to do a test run on a square piece of paper. Denise suggests a magazine page is a good one -- thin paper that you can crisply fold is great -- but you can also do a larger one by using printer paper (cut the extra strip away so you have a square to start). Bring as many as you like :)

We also have extra cranes already made -- so if this activity isn't the one for you, we've got you covered!
