STUDENT SUMMER EMPLOYMENT AT KUC

Kitchissippi UC invites applications from youth and young adults seeking summer employment.

The Education Outreach Program Coordinator will help to enthusiastically plan and deliver engaging educational programs and learning events. With input from our ministry team and leadership circles, the coordinator may work on a variety of projects and topics such as Indigenous Right Relations and Reconciliation, environment, equity, and Affirming LGBTQ2+.

This job has some flexibility in approach and candidates can identify their strengths and interests.

We anticipate a mix of remote and in-person work; a workspace will be available at Kitchissippi United Church (630 Island Park Drive).

Activities to include helping to create intergenerational and child/youth programming on themes of social justice, equity, and ecology, with mentorship from experienced educators.

Help prepare and co-host webinars and in-person gatherings through the summer (could be children's program hours, guest speakers on equity and allyship, music jam sessions, documentary watch parties, nature walks, etc.)

Help prepare, source, and deliver engaging at-home learning kits for families with theme-based programs (e.g., mindfulness, science experiments, ecological stewardship, nature exploration, art and faith, etc).

Assist with multimedia ways to develop learning materials (could filming and video editing, , or other options depending on candidate interests).

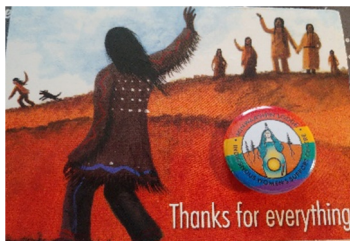
Help lead creative community-building events (paint nights, music jams, nature excursions, book clubs community clean-ups, or other options depending on candidate interests). This is a great opportunity for creative work! Applicants are encouraged to share their skillsets and ideas. Ideal for those with interest in education, religious studies, or social studies. Because some of this will be remote, independent work, we are seeking candidates who are able to stay motivated and take initiative, with some team support and mentorship.

7 weeks, \$16.50/hour, 35 hours per week (flex time available)

Eligibility: because this is funded by Canada Summer Jobs, candidates must be between the ages of 15-30, legally able to work in Ontario, and must be either Canadian citizens or permanent residents, or hold refugee status in Canada (international students not eligible).

KUC LIVESTREAMING APPEAL

To improve our livestreaming capability and quality at KUC and increase the activities for which live streaming can be used, we would like to add:

A camera to be mounted on the south wall of the chancel (beyond the left-hand speaker in the picture below), to focus in on activities there—lectern, communion table, pulpit, piano, singers, organ—from a side angle, and on the congregation; and...

A camera to take good quality video of Kitchissippi activities and events outside the building, in the Alcove Garden and in front of the church. These cameras would be wired and controlled remotely, from the balcony. The cost of the chancel camera and installation will be \$2700, and the outside camera a maximum of \$1500.

The church technology budget and already pledged donations will cover at least half the cost; we are looking to raise up to \$2000 from congregational members who would like to support these enhancements.



Why these additions to our system?

The chancel camera would provide close-up shots of activity in the chancel area, taken from a side view. Having multiple camera angles is a well-established approach to produce scenes that capture and keep an audience's interest. During a wedding in November, for example, we tried to get shots of the bride coming down the aisle, the vows and so forth, using an iPhone on a tripod, but it didn't work well. The images broke up or froze, largely because the camera was transmitting to the balcony system via wifi rather than wire.

This camera would also make the transitions between shots of different activities (e.g., from the lectern reader, to choir, to minister in the pulpit) smoother and faster than is possible at present. Kitchissippi puts on a number of outside activities on our beautiful grounds, both in summer and in winter, which we would like to capture and use in our livestream broadcasts. The portable, 'outside' camera would enable us to do that.

Our tech team, which now consists of four young operators, is working on more advanced camera and presentation techniques than we started with last year. These added cameras will support what they are trying to do, as well as enhance our visual livestream coverage significantly.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL EOORC and UCC MEMBERS WHO RECEIVE EMAILS FROM US

Scammers posing as managers, leaders and colleagues have been targeting people asking for assistance in purchasing gift cards. The emails usually have a subject line like this:

- need your help
- can you do something for me
- can you do me a favour?

If you get an unexpected email like this:

- **Look at the email address.** You will notice that it's not the email address usually used by your manager or colleague. It's often a gmail or hotmail account, sometimes with spelling mistakes.
- **Double-check with your supervisor.** Call your boss using a known number — not something that was written in the email.
- **Take a pause.** Can't reach your manager? Wait till you can and don't reply to the email.
- **Remember,** no member of the EOORC community should ask you to pay for something up front with the promise of reimbursement without prior approval from your finance manager.
- **Delete the email.** You can report it to me (ajansman@united-church.ca) and I will send it on to the tech team at GCO. They are aware of this scam. Have a look at this [article](#) from the Retail Council of Canada.
