We are looking at longer term accommodation in Ottawa but with short notice being very likely, does anyone have or know of a temporary furnished space for perhaps a couple of weeks or so when they arrive? Our Syrian family several years ago was very fortunate to have a "soft landing space" for a short time till they moved into an apartment. Please ask family and friends if they know of available short term space and notify the church at 613-722-7254 if you have suggestions. Once the family is here we will collect needed items but not until then.


FALL 2022- COVID PROTOCOL UPDATE

We will not be checking vaccine status. We know that two doses of the original vaccine provide minimal protection against the current Omicron strains. Boosters do help. There is a new bivalent vaccine providing better protection against the Omicron variant and we encourage all members of the congregation to get this booster dose when they are eligible.

- 1. The sanctuary and hall will return to full capacity use. If eating or drinking in the Hall, people must be seated with 6 foot spacing, and masks should be replaced as soon as the snack has been eaten.
- 2. We will continue to require masks, preferably KN95s and will allow congregational singing with masks on. Masks are available at all entrances. All choir members are welcome to return to practices and Sunday worship wearing masks if they are comfortable with the distancing limitations in the choir loft.
- 3. Children's programming will resume September 11, including the nursery. For the Fall, many of the preschool, elementary school and young adults' activities will take place outdoors. As with the adults in the congregation, we ask that children over the age of two wear a face mask and be vaccinated as they are eligible. Proof will not be required.
- 4. We will continue to open windows and use the hall ventilation system. People are asked to dress warmly as the outdoor temperatures fall. We are purchasing three Hepa Filters to be used in the board room, chapel and parlour for children's programming and small group meetings. We encourage Circles to meet by Zoom as winter sets in.
- 5. We ask people not to crowd too closely together while inside the church. We will continue to plan for safe spacing at worship and social events.
- 6. We will continue to supply and request that people use hand sanitizer and minimize sharing of communal objects.

Masks are still an effective public health measure to reduce COVID-19 transmission

- Public health measures, including increased ventilation and filtration, physical distancing and wearing a well-fitted, high quality mask can help reduce SARS-CoV-2 transmission in places where people gather indoors.
- Recent studies from the United States analysed the impact of mask wearing on SARS-CoV-2 community transmission: mandatory masking reduced the incidence of SARS-CoV-2 infection consistently.
- Masking protects both the person who wears the mask and others.
- Community benefits from masking are most pronounced when adopted widely.

KUC LIVESTREAMING APPEAL IS COMPLETE

Over the summer, we appealed for donations to install a new pan-tilt-zoom camera on the sanctuary wall, above the piano. This was to give us better coverage of activities at the front of the church, including events such as weddings. The new camera angle will also make it easier for us to switch between views of the lectern, the pulpit and the choir, etc., and show the faces of our congregation, rather than the backs of heads!

The new camera will be operational in September.

Through your generosity, we have raised \$2740, which will cover the full cost of the new camera and connections to the balcony.

Together with existing funds in the technology budget, this will enable us to acquire another camera for use outside the church, to give us live feed for events in the garden or in front of a church building, for example. We would also be able to livestream activities in the chapel.

These enhancements will support what our team of dedicated young tech operators—Kyle, Mason and Bramand other volunteers and staff are doing every Sunday, providing interesting audio video material in the sanctuary, and livestreaming our services. We are also looking at opportunities to use our technology systems to support our partners in the community.

Thank you again for your generosity, and for your vote of confidence in how we are using technology to help us adapt, as a congregation, to life in the covid and post-covid environment we find ourselves in.
