After a successful fall season of performances and raising more than \$5,000 for such causes as the Multifaith Housing Initiative, a refugee sponsorship group, the Jewish Community Centre and Soul Space (First United), I am doing three more performances in March-April, two of which are in United Church sanctuaries. Several clergy people have attended performances.

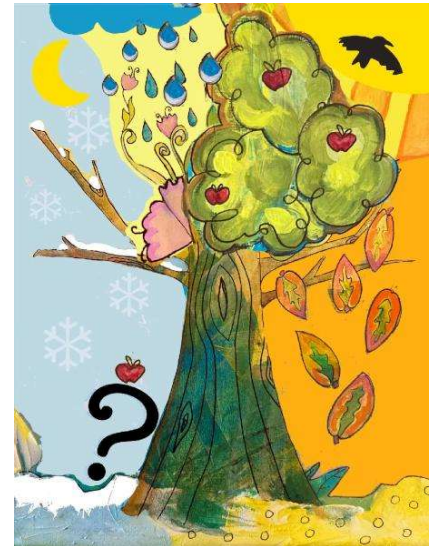
